Marine Corps History

MAY

Viet Nam 50th Anniversary / 8 March / After some ten years of U.S. military advisor support, the first combat troops landed in Viet Nam on 8 March 1965 when Marines of the 9th Marine Expeditionary Brigade (MEB, later renamed the III Marine Amphibious Force) landed at Da Nang to secure the airfield base. The Marine force in I Corps grew to a full reinforced Division / Wing Marine Amphibious Force of 25,000 during the summer of 1965. SE Asia Conflict statistics: KIA 13,073 & WIA 88,633. - **15 May 1862** Corporal John Mackie, the first Marine to earn the Medal of Honor, was commended for his actions against Confederate shore batteries at Drewry's Bluff which blocked the approach to Richmond along the James River.
- **22 May 1912** Marine aviation began on this day when 1st Lt. Alfred A. Cunning- ham reported to the Navy air training school at Annapolis MD. Navy aviation had be- gun just a month before. Semper Fi magazine featured this history in their Jan/Feb and Mar/Apr issues, so we won't con-dense it into a few sentences here. Read about it in all its lengthy glory in Semper Fi.
- **2 May 1946** Marines aided in suppressing a prison riot at Alcatraz Penitentiary in San Francisco.
- 23 May 1988 V-22 Osprey, the first production tilt-rotor aircraft, made its debut.
- **8 May 1995** Marines and sailors assisted in the evacuation of 2,500 civilians from the New Orle-ans after it was hit by a devastating hurricane, while Navy corpsmen treated a great many victims of that storm.


